Central Government

Government Departments
 Ministerial and Non Ministerial Departments. Ultimately responsible for the provision of all Public Services. Headed by a Permanent Secretary and often divided into directorates. In Scotland Wales and Northern Ireland (devolved Government) each have a series of Departments independent of England, making their own policy decisions.

Executive Agencies and NDPB's
 Funded by Government Departments. Fulfilling some of the operational responsibilities of the Departments and Co-ordinating and funding other organisations. Also includes arms length advice and arbitration.

Health Boards (Scotland/Wales)
 Co-ordinate and run all primary and secondary healthcare.

CCG's (England)
 Boards of GP's and other Health and Social Care professionals that Commission Healthcare Services

Top Tier Councils
 County, Unitary and Metropolitan Councils, provide Social Care, Education, Highways, Environmental, Public Health, Housing*, Planning* (*Except in English County Councils)

Schools
 Broadly come in 3 types. Private (self funded). State Maintained (Local Authority Funded) and Academies (Funded by Central Govt).
